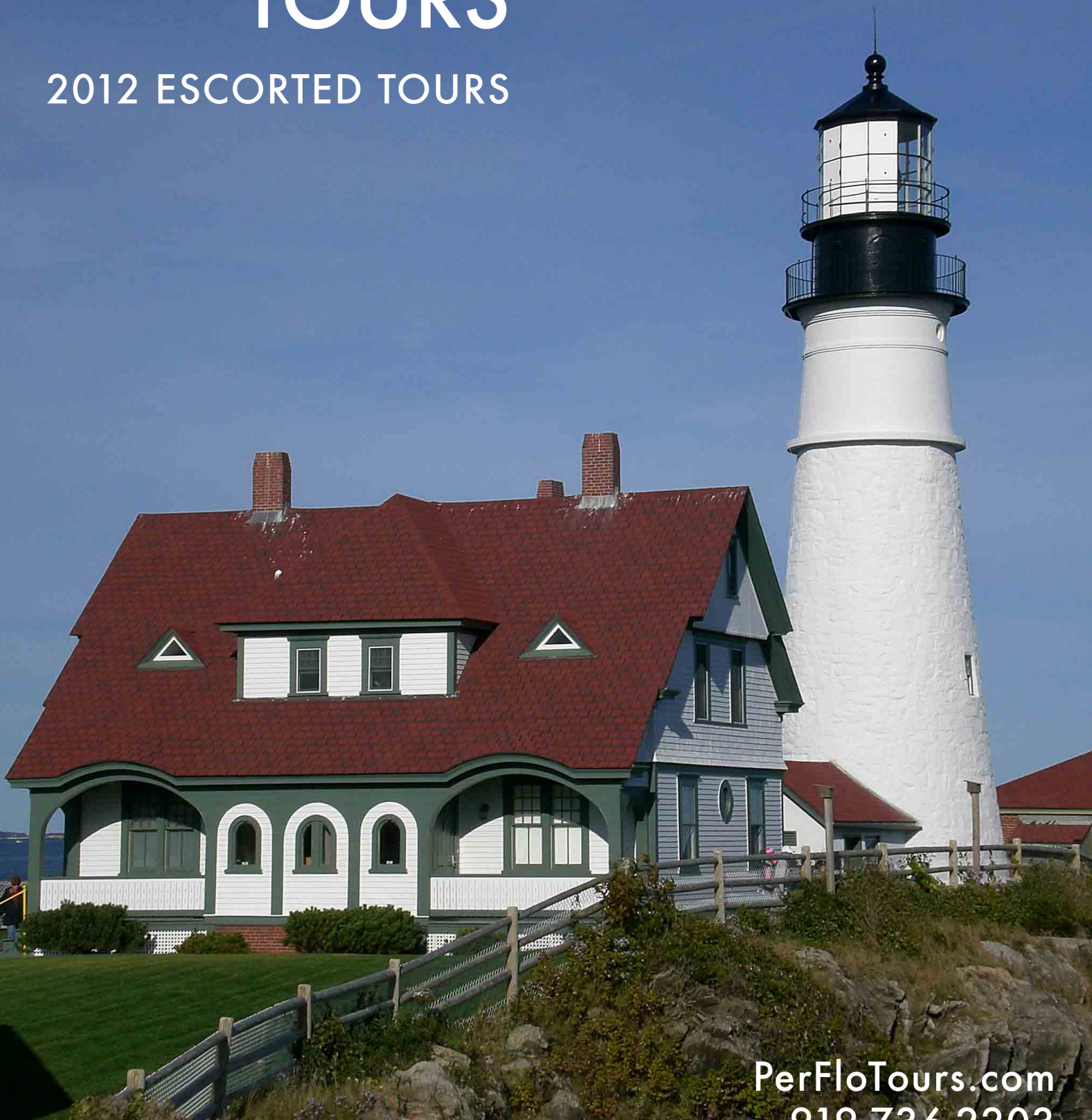

UNDECIDED TOUR

If you know you want to take one of our trips in 2012 but are not sure which one, you may pay a deposit of \$150.00 and we will hold it in “undecided” until you decide. You will still qualify for the discount when you decide. It is better to decide early because some tours fill rapidly and you might not be able to get the space when you decide.

QUESTION: Suppose I decide to cancel the tour due to unforeseen circumstances?

ANSWER: Our very liberal cancellation policy allows you to cancel most tours up to 30 days without any penalty unless we have purchased non-refundable tickets and cannot resell your space. If you cancel within 30 days before departure the penalty is \$25.00 per person, plus any non-refundable theater tickets or other non-refundable cost, in which case it will be deducted from your deposit. Our fly tours do involve other expenses such as airline tickets which are often nonrefundable. Cancellation insurance is available for purchase.

QUESTION: Suppose I decide to change from the trip I book early to another trip? Can my deposit, with discounts, be switched?

ANSWER: Yes, you may switch to another trip without penalty if there is space on the new trip.

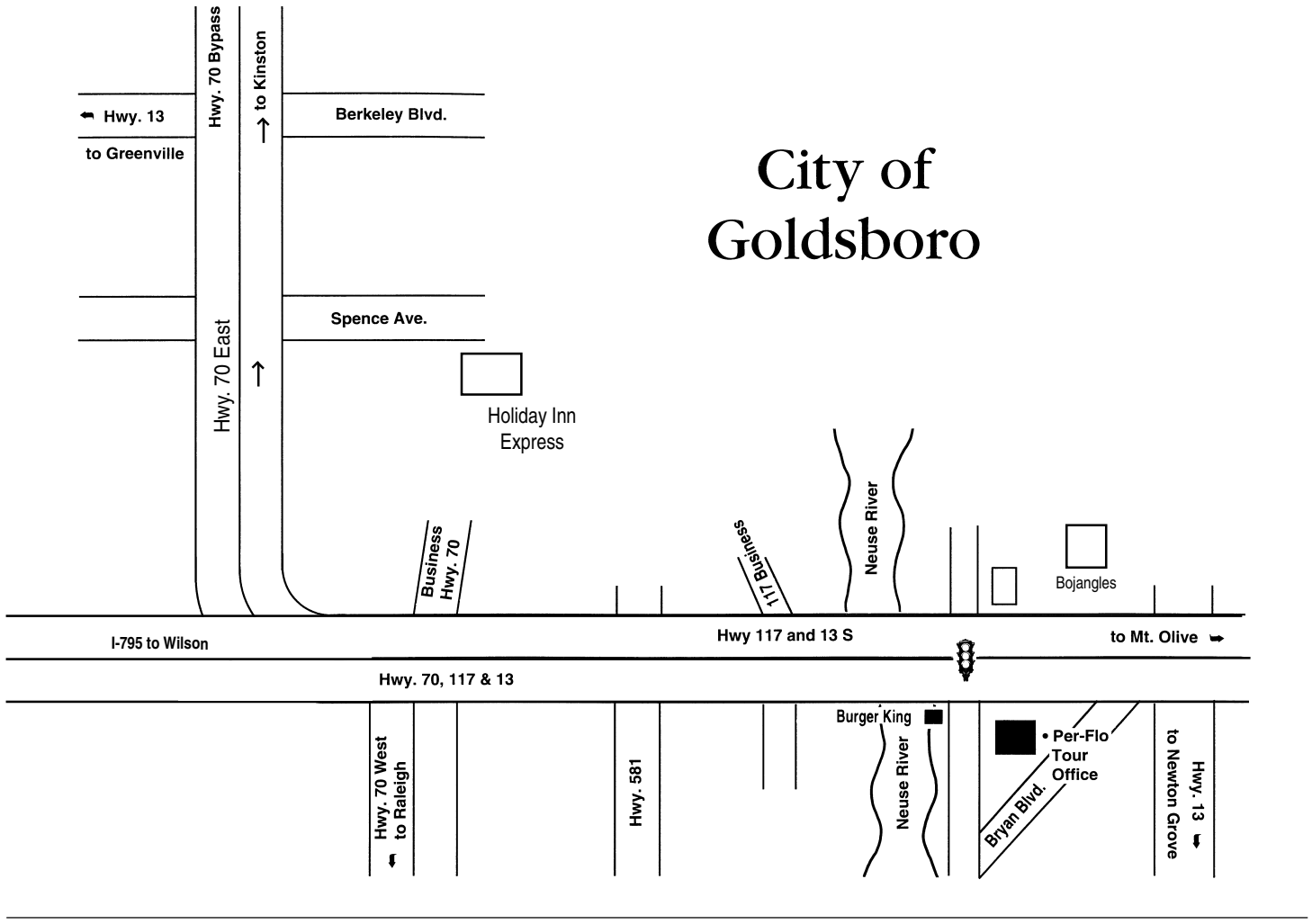

2012 TOUR INFORMATION

1. DEPARTURES: Most tours originate in Goldsboro at the **PER-FLO TOUR OFFICE** located at 339 Bryan Blvd. on Highway 117 & 13 South of Goldsboro. We have a parking lot available for you to leave your car. We can arrange a pick-up enroute on a tour.

2. RESERVATIONS, DEPOSITS AND BALANCE PAYMENTS:

To confirm your reservation, please fill out the reservation form found in the back of this catalog. Mail it, along with your deposit check to: **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.**, 339 Bryan Blvd., Goldsboro, NC 27530. The balance is due 45 days prior to departure on most tours. Tours that include cruises or airline tickets have a special balance due date.

SEE SPECIAL DEPOSIT AND BALANCE DUE DATE
ON CRUISES & FLY TOURS

You will receive a receipt when we post your payments. Tour information & luggage tags will be mailed 2-3 weeks before departure. If you do not receive tour information 2 weeks prior to departure, please call our office.

3. CANCELLATION: If it is necessary to cancel your reservation on a tour 30 days or more before departure, you will receive a full refund, unless tickets or non-refundable deposits have been made by **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.**, in which case the non-recoverable cost will be deducted unless we are able to resell your space. If the cancellation occurs less than 30 days before departure, a \$25.00 per person, penalty fee will be charged, plus any non-recoverable expense. The refund will be made when all bills and accounting is completed on that individual tour. We recommend cancellation insurance especially if the tour involves a large sum of money. If you do not show up the morning of departure or you leave the tour after it is in progress, there is no refund.

SPECIAL CANCELLATION CONDITIONS: Cruises and Fly Tours have special cancellation conditions and refunds. In most cases we are working with a special operator such as the cruise lines and they have very strict refund policies. Please inquire about the policies when you book your tour. Some tours include cancellation insurance and you are automatically insured and would receive a full refund less your insurance premium which is never refunded.

CANCELLATION BY PER-FLO TOURS, INC.: Per-Flo Tours, Inc., reserves the right to cancel a tour in the event an insufficient number of reservations is secured within 3 weeks of departure. In this event, **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.**, will refund all payments made to us as quickly as possible. **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** will be responsible only

for money collected, not for any inconvenience that it may have caused. We do not cancel a tour unless we absolutely have to. It is an expense to us and we do not like to disappoint our clients. **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** will not be liable for cancellation of scheduled activities, delays or other inconveniences caused by acts of nature, such as storms, a sub-contractor's lack of performance, such as cancellation of a show, delays such as traffic jams, and other events which are beyond the control of **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** **If tour is cancelled due to storm, hurricane, flood, act of nature or terrorism, every effort will be made to reschedule the tour. If a client cannot take the rescheduled tour, a credit will be given on another tour.**

4. SEAT ROTATION: Seating arrangements will be rotated once a day on most trips. The Tour Director will carry out this rotation with a system designed by Per-Flo Tours, Inc., to increase the comfort and enjoyment of all passengers. **Under no circumstances will special seats be reserved, however if a passenger does not want to rotate, he or she may sit in one of the back seats and the others will be rotated. If he or she chooses to do this, he or she cannot get into rotation later during the trip, but must sit in the back during the entire tour.**

5. SMOKING: Due to popular demand and government regulation, there cannot be smoking allowed on the motorcoach. We stop often for breaks and smokers can smoke at break.

... **VERY IMPORTANT** ...

6. LUGGAGE: You are allowed one suitcase per person on each tour **NOT TO EXCEED 50 POUNDS**. You may also bring only one small piece of luggage which will fit overhead in the bins or under the seat. If you are flying and the luggage exceeds the legal weight, the airlines could fine you up to \$100 to check your luggage. You will be sent one (1) luggage tag and this is to be placed on your one (1) suitcase. The carry-on luggage should not be larger than approximately 16" x 10" x 8" and light enough for you to lift it to place it overhead in the coach.

7. DRINKS AND SNACKS: A cooler with ice will be provided on the coach. You may bring soft drinks, juice, milk, bottled water, etc., to place in the cooler during the tour. No alcoholic beverages are allowed to be placed in the cooler or to be consumed on the Motorcoach.

8. MOTORCOACHES: Per-Flo Tours, Inc., uses the best available equipment for our tours. These coaches have features such as reclining seats, air conditioning, lavatory and public address sys-

tem. We charter our coaches from reliable and reputable local companies.

9. COACH COURTESIES: Persons traveling alone need to share a pair of seats with another passenger. **Under no circumstance will certain seats be reserved for any passenger.** In areas with heavy traffic or difficult highway conditions passengers should remain seated for their comfort and safety. All persons must be seated before our motorcoach may proceed from a stop. Do not occupy the Tour Director's seat (the pair of seats directly behind the driver).

10. TOUR MEMBERSHIP: We reserve the right to reject or terminate the passage of any person whom the company may consider objectionable to others in the group. In the event of the termination of passenger, **PER-FLO TOURS INC.**, will not be liable for any costs or inconvenience incurred by the person(s) whose passage is terminated. Refunds in this event will be treated in the same manner as though an individual cancels after the tour is in progress. — (see item 3, cancellation). **Persons with disabilities are encouraged to contact PER-FLO TOURS, INC. to discuss issues of safety and convenience prior to making a reservation for any tour. Persons needing personal assistance as a result of their disability are encouraged to bring a companion. Our tour directors and drivers have many responsibilities and cannot devote full time to one person. It is not fair to the other passengers. If a wheelchair is needed by a client, it should be discussed with office personnel before booking a tour.**

11. PERSONAL INSURANCE: We recommend that adequate baggage, accident and sickness insurance be purchased. We have put a tremendous amount of effort into making your trip pleasant and enjoyable. However, we cannot guarantee against the possibility of accident, sickness, loss of luggage, or unforeseen events that could result in your having to cancel or interrupt your trip. Therefore we strongly recommend that you purchase travel insurance that allows you to choose coverage to protect you and give you peace of mind. Remember, **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged articles and luggage when in the care of hotels, etc.

12. TOUR DIRECTOR: Our Tour Directors have a big responsibility and handle these responsibilities very well. They are familiar with the route and the attractions along the route. However, sometimes clients expect tour directors to have the same knowledge as a local tour guide trained in special areas, and that is almost impossible. We hire step-on guides for areas of special interest.

13. RESPONSIBILITY: PER-FLO TOURS, INC., acts only as agent for transportation companies, hotels, restaurants and other travel service. Therefore, **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** does not assume liability for injury, damage, loss, accident or delay due to any act or

default of any company or person engaged in transporting the passengers or rendering any other travel service. **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** does not assume responsibility for loss of personal property, luggage or personal injury while tour members are guests at hotels, restaurants or other attractions included or not included as part of the tour. **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** reserves the right to cancel or alter a tour if circumstances make such changes necessary or for the safety of the passengers. Every effort possible will be made to give passengers a safe, comfortable and enjoyable tour.

14. GRATUITIES: Most passengers like to show the Tour Director and Driver a special appreciation for providing a nice trip for them. Please extend these gratuities to them personally, not in a group collection form. The Tour Director and Driver like to tell you a special thank you and like to know the gift is from you. Some clients offer \$2.00 per person, per day to each the Driver and the Tour Director. Gratuities are a personal gesture and the amount is determined by you.

15. PARKING: We do have space at our office for parking your vehicle while you are on tour. If you leave your car at one of our other pick-up points, please let the hotel, etc. know you are leaving it. Our lot has a partial fenced area and plenty of night lights. However, we do not assume responsibility for any vandalism or loss of property. We have never had a problem but things can happen.

16. LOCAL ACCOMMODATIONS: If you would like to spend the night nearby before or after your tour, call us to make your reservation for the best rate.

17. CELL PHONES: Other passengers are not interested in your cell phone conversation. As a courtesy to others, please do not use your cell phone on the coach, except under urgent situations.

18. PERFUME: Many people have become sensitive to perfume and fragrances. Please consider that on the coach.

FLO'S TRAVEL TIPS

Before you leave home, you should plan carefully, not only your trip, but for the safety and security of your home, family, pets and friends. Leaving with the assurance that all you love will be safe while you are away paves the road for a good vacation.

(1) Your envelope containing luggage tags, pick-up points, hotel addresses and telephone numbers will arrive at least two weeks or 10 days before departure. Leave a copy of your itinerary and the hotel telephone numbers with a family member or friend.

(2) Leave a house key with a neighbor or friend. Ask the person to check your house or apartment each day. You might have plants to be watered at this time and you may be assured that your home is being cared for.

(3) If your trip is taking you out of the country, be sure to apply for your passport early. Sometimes it takes 3 months or more to get a passport. Check with our travel department if you think you might need a visa also. **Canada and all cruises might require a passport.** Be sure to check with our office for the requirements on each trip out of the country. **NEVER** pack your passport in your luggage. Keep it in your purse or pocket.

(4) Your trip may be more interesting if you read about the area before departure. You could get some books from the library or buy some from the bookstore. Take an atlas or maps of the area with you on the trip, so that you may follow the route as you travel.

(5) Be sure to carry plenty of any medication which you normally take. This should be packed in your carry-on luggage or purse, never in your checked luggage.

(6) I strongly recommend buying travelers checks instead of taking a lot of cash. I have found that \$20 denominations are best, even though it means a lot of signing at the bank. Most restaurants or stores accept the checks and will give you the change from small denominations. The hotels will also cash them for you. Credit cards such as Mastercard and Visa are widely accepted. When using your credit cards in foreign countries, you do not have to worry about the exchange, since it is done at the bank. It is wise not to carry a lot of credit cards while traveling, only the ones you might need. It is also wise not to carry an excess of cash and do not carry all of your money in the same place, instead, divide it and carry it in a couple of places.

(7) If you are flying, pack a change of underclothes, night clothes, cosmetics, razor, hair dryer, medication and other necessities in a carry-on bag. Your checked luggage might be lost or delayed, so this could make you more comfortable while you wait for your bag.

(8) **PACKING TIPS:** You will find heavy, stuffed luggage is a problem, especially if you are on a long trip. Take fewer clothes such as dark slacks or skirts with several matching shirts or blouses. You will need a sweater and probably a jacket to match. Most hotels have indoor swimming pools now, so take your swim suit. Most hotels have washers and dryers so you can launder your clothes when necessary. Don't forget to take comfortable shoes for walking and clothing that is comfortable. I always pack the following items also:

(a) Alarm Clock (b) Headache Medication (c) Couple of Washcloths (especially overseas tours) (d) Flashlight (e) Hand Mirror (f) Hair Dryer & Curling Iron (g) Snack Items (h) Needle & Thread (i) Kleenex Tissue

(9) **GRATUITY:** On several occasions during your tour, you will encounter individuals that perform services for you and you might like to reward them with a tip. Many times we are asked by our clients what is the appropriate amount to give these people. Waiters and waitresses usually get 15% of the food cost. For taxi drivers, about 10% is appropriate. You may extend a gratuity to other persons such as hair dressers, shoe shine persons, tour guides, bus drivers and others. When on a cruise, a suggestion is left in your cabin, but I usually leave a tip for these individuals according to the amount of service each gave me. Sometimes it is more, sometimes less than suggested. Tour Guides and Bus Drivers, if these individuals do an exceptional tour for you, you might contribute \$2.00 per day.

(10) **INSURANCE:** If you are taking a trip of 4 days or more, I suggest the trip cancellation or interruption insurance. Once a tour is in progress, it is difficult to obtain a refund from hotels and attractions. The insurance will assure you of getting most of your money back. Luggage insurance is also recommended especially if you are flying.

(11) Plan ahead for your trip. Try to relax and get a good nights sleep before leaving. Leave your problems at home. Leave with a positive attitude and a determination to have a good time. Don't let minor problems upset you during the trip. Food will taste different, people will speak with an accent, customs will vary, but that's what you want to experience. You will enjoy your vacation if you want to!!

(12) If you are flying, get up once or twice and stretch. Walk from one end of the plane to the other. Drink lots of water and eat less than normal to help control swelling. Prop your feet up if possible. Take a good book or magazine to read. This helps to pass the time. Relax and make yourself as comfortable as possible.

(13) **CHANGING FLIGHTS:** Always find your departing gate as soon as possible. After finding your gate, then go to the rest room, newsstand, or restaurant. Boarding often begins as early as 25 minutes before flight time, so return to your gate early. Upon arrival at your destination, wait for your Tour Director if you are flying with a group, then proceed to the luggage claim area. If you are traveling out of the country, you will need to go through customs first. Keep your Tour Director in view. Sometimes the airport is very crowded, but it is important to stay together.

(14) When you are a member of a **PER-FLO TOURS, INC.** motorcoach tour, you will be given a written itinerary which describes the departure times each day, as well as other information. If there are changes that need to be made, your Tour Director will instruct you on this as soon as he or she knows the change.

*** VERY IMPORTANT ***

LUGGAGE: You are allowed one suitcase per person on each tour (not to exceed 50 lbs.). You may also bring one small carry-on case which you handle throughout the tour. The price of each tour includes the cost of having a bellman handle one suitcase for you at each hotel. (The luggage tag mailed to you after booking one of our tours is for this suitcase.) In order to control the costs of our tour and because of space limitations on the motorcoach we have to limit each passenger to one suitcase and one carry-on piece. Please do not place your carry-on piece with your main suitcase at any time during the tour. Your one very small carry-on case should be approximately 16" x 10" x 8". Do not take more than one carry-on because there is insufficient room on the coach to store it.
